PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

The SLTA held meetings January 15, and April 14, 2021. The AGM has been set for Tuesday, June 29, 2021.

A meeting with the SLA (Saskatchewan Library Association) was held by ZOOM in February. The SLA director and President, as well as the SLTA executive director and myself were present. Library advocacy and how to make our briefs to the Minister more impactful were the main topics of discussion.

The SLTA is focusing on three main mandates:

Trustee Training

An informational package for new trustees called "In a Nutshell", was sent to member library regions to help acclimatize new members to their board roles. The PLLO was also approached about the possibility of a workshop on these materials.

Advocacy

The SLTA will focus on advocacy as opposed to advertising in its promotion of libraries. Using materials and stories that highlight public library success collected from regions, the SLTA will prepare brief documents sharing the value libraries bring to their communities.

Ministers Brief

The shared creation of the Brief to the Minister by library regions and the SLTA has created a solid document which we be sharing in a dialogue with the Minister of Education. It is hoped that this brief will once again allow a dialogue that will create discussions that last well beyond the day of the brief. This year we will also be sharing the written Brief with other government Ministries that are impacted by public libraries. The Minister of Parks, Culture, and Sports; Minister of Mental Health and Addictions and Seniors and Rural and Remote Health.

I would like to thank our executive director Nancy Kennedy and the SLTA board for all their support over the year.
